Please join schools across Tennessee in honoring our bus drivers. We appreciate all they do!







The EAP is making a difference in so many ways and the A-Team has a responsibility to let as many people as possible know about the program and the appreciation days they celebrate.

Newsletter templates can be found on the internet or the paparazzi can can create one on their own. The newsletter doesn't have to be very long or have a fancy format. It should highlight appreciation day activities and the employees being honored. You'll likely want to use several photos in each edition. In each appreciation day packet, we will include a page of suggested items for inclusion in your newsletter.

For the first issue of your new newsletter, introduce the A-Team, give a brief overview of the program, and list the appreciation days. We'll send a page of suggestions for the first newsletter soon. Encourage your students, staff and community to get involved in the appreciation day activities and show appreciation to the school employees.

Ask all students, staff, parents, grandparents, etc. to submit their email addresses so the paparazzi can send the newsletter to as many people as possible. By doing this you are giving the A-Team ownership of their program and it can also create positive publicity for your school. We hope that the A-Team will make a special effort to get students to submit names and e-mail addresses of friends and family serving in the military or living in other states or countries. It'll be fun to see how many states and countries your A-Team newsletter can go to.

2011 utrust Writing Competition

Have you ever had a teacher who made a difference in your life?
