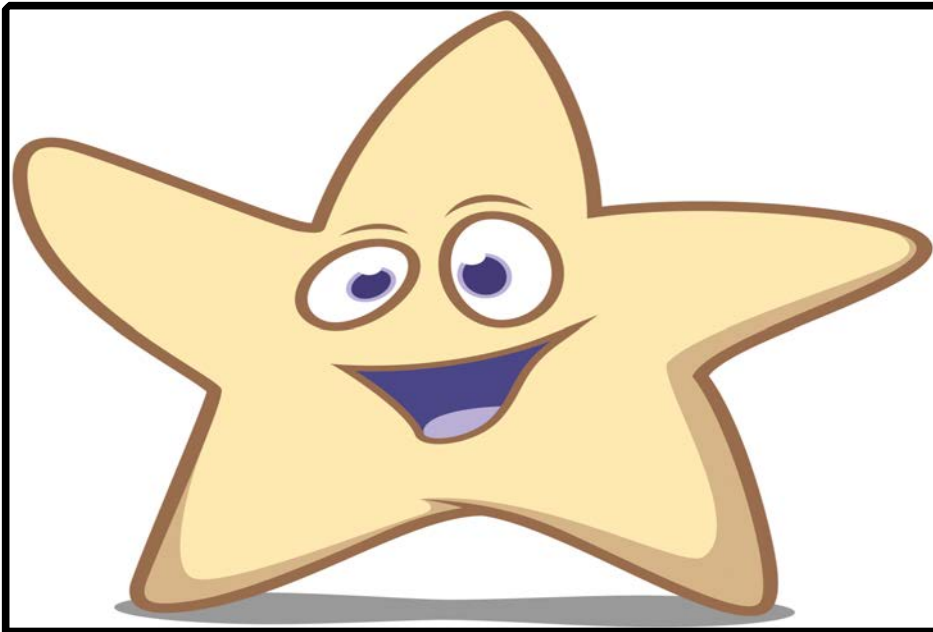

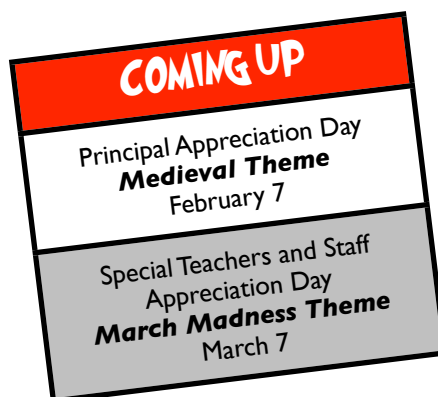
Exciting News! Introducing the Lucky Star

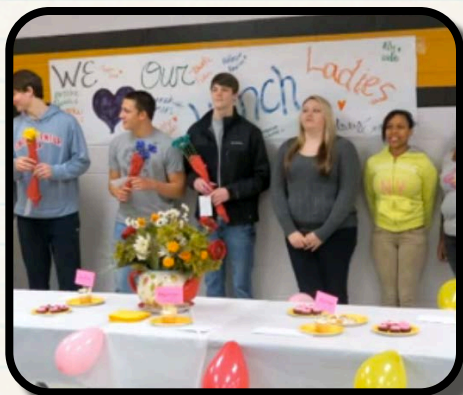
